SUBJECT: County 9-1-1 Fee

Background

- 1. Under current State law, the State collects a \$0.50 monthly fee from each telephone subscriber in the State to help State agencies and county governments pay for expanding and enhancing their existing 9-1-1 Emergency Telephone Systems.
- 2. Maryland Code Section 1-311 of the Public Safety Article authorizes Maryland counties to impose by resolution an additional county 9-1-1 fee to fund the county's costs to operate and maintain its 9-1-1 Emergency Telephone System. For a fiscal year, the county 9-1-1 fee may exceed\$0.75 per month to an amount sufficient to cover the county's projected operational costs for the 9-1-1 system if revenues attributable to the county 9-1-1 fee for the previous fiscal year did not provide the revenues necessary to cover the county's operational costs for the 9-1-1 system for that fiscal year.
- 3. On July 29, 2003, the County Council adopted Resolution 15-282, setting the additional County fee at \$0.75 per month for all current bills rendered for switched local exchange access service or Commercial Mobile Radio Service (CMRS) or other 9-1-1-accessible service in the County.
- 4. The revenues attributable to the County 9-1-1 fee of \$0.75 per month were insufficient to cover the County's operational costs for the 9-1-1 system for Fiscal Year 2025 and are projected to be insufficient to cover the County's operational costs for the 9-1-1 system for Fiscal Year 2026.
- 5. Notice of public hearing was given, and public hearing was held.

Action

The County Council for Montgomery County, Maryland, approves the following resolution:

- For Fiscal Year 2026, but no sooner than sixty days following the County's certification of the amount of the 9-1-1 fee to the Comptroller, a County charge of \$1.47 per month is applied to all current bills rendered for switched local exchange access service or Commercial Mobile Radio Service (CMRS) or other 9-1-1-accessible service in the County. This charge remains in effect until the next fiscal year's fee becomes effective.
- The telephone companies and other providers of 9-1-1-accessible services must collect and remit the additional charges according to State law.
- The Director of Finance must promptly certify the amount of the County charge, as modified by this Resolution, to the Maryland Public Service Commission, the Maryland 9-1-1 Board, and the Comptroller of the State to meet the requirements of State law.
- This Resolution takes effect on July 1, 2025, and supersedes Resolution 15-282, except that the \$1.47 charge does not take effect until sixty days following the County's certification to the Comptroller of the modified fee.
