(b) *Non-merit positions*. The Department has 5 senior level management positions that are non-merit positions. These positions consist of a chief [operating officer] of Public Health Services; a chief of Services to End and Prevent Homelessness; a chief of Aging and Disability Services; a chief of Behavioral Health and Crisis Services; and a chief of Children, Youth, and Family Services. [In addition, the Health Officer referred to in Section 2-42 serves as the chief of the Direct Service Division for Public Health Services.] The chief of Public Health Services also serves as the Deputy Health Officer.
