AN EXPEDITED ACT to:

- (1) continue the operation of the Advisory Board for the Montgomery Cares Program;
- (2) repeal the automatic termination date for the Advisory Board for the Montgomery Cares Program;
- (3) modify the mission and duties of the Board to include underinsured County residents;
- (4) define low-income for the purposes of the Board's duties;
- (5) modify the composition of the Board's members;
- (6) require the Board to elect a vice chair; and
- (7) generally amend the law governing the Advisory Board for Montgomery Cares.

By amending

Montgomery County Code Chapter 24, Health and Sanitation Sections 24-47, 24-49, 24-50, 24-51, 24-52, and 24-53

1	Sec. 1. Sections 24-47, 24-49, 24-50, 24-51, 24-52, and 24-53 are

3	24-47. Definitions.
4	In this article the following words have the meanings indicated[;]:
5	Area median income means the median household income for the Washington
6	-Arlington-Alexandria, DC-VA-MD HUD Metro FMR Area as estimated by
7	the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, adjusted by
8	household size, or its successor.
9	Board means the Advisory Board for the Montgomery Cares Program.
10	Department means the Department of Health and Human Services.
11	Low-income means 80% or less of area median income.
12	Program means the Department's health care delivery system that provides
13	primary medical care and other essential health care and related services,
14	through public/private partnerships, to low-income, [and] uninsured, and
15	underinsured residents of the County.
16	24-49. Mission.
17	The Board's mission is to advise and recommend policies that ensure access to
18	high quality, efficient health care and related services for low-income, [and]
19	uninsured, and underinsured County residents.
20	24-50. Members; appointments; terms.
21	(a) <i>Total members</i> . The Board has [17] <u>19</u> members.
22	(b) <i>Ex officio members</i> . Subject to confirmation by the County Council, the
23	County Executive should appoint the following individuals to serve as
24	ex officio members of the Board:
25	(1) The County Health Officer or Officer's designee; and
26	(2) The Chief of the Department's Behavioral Health and Crisis
27	Service or the Chief's designee.

- (c) *Other members.* Subject to confirmation by the County Council, the
 County Executive should appoint the following individuals to serve on
 the Board:
- 31 (1) 2 representatives of community health care providers that
 32 participate in the Program;
- 33 (2) 1 representative of hospitals that participate in the Program;
- 34 (3) The chair of the Board of Directors of the entity that contracts

- (5) [3] <u>4</u> individuals who have knowledge of and experience with
 issues relating to health care for uninsured individuals such as
 primary care, specialty care, dental care, behavioral health care,
 or fiscal matters relating to any of these types of care;
- 42 (6) 1 representative of the Commission on Health;
- 43 (7) 1 representative of the County Medical Society; <u>and</u>
- 44 (8) 2 current or former recipients of services under the Program [;

- 46 (9) 1 representative from a Managed Care Organization who is
 47 familiar with Medicaid and insurance issues affecting low48 income populations].

- 50 24-51. Voting; chair and vice chair; meetings; compensation.
- 51 (a) *Voting*. All members of the Board are voting members.
- 52 (b) *Chair <u>and vice chair</u>*. The members of the Board must elect a chair <u>and</u>
 53 <u>vice chair</u> by majority vote to serve a 1-year term.
- 54 (c) *Meetings*. The Board must meet at least 10 times each year.

(d) *Compensation*. Except as provided in subsection (e), a member must 55 56 serve without compensation. Expenses. A member may request reimbursement for mileage and 57 (e) dependent care costs at rates established by the County. 58 24-52. Duties and staff. 59 Duties. The Board may advise the County Executive, County Council, 60 (a) 61 and Department on any matter relating to the goal of ensuring a steady and measurable [growth] improvement in accessibility [in the number] 62 of low-income, uninsured, and underinsured County residents accessing 63 high quality health care services, including: 64 (1) Eligibility criteria for participating health care providers; 65 Eligibility criteria for individuals served by the Program; 66 (2)The method for allocating Program funds; (3) 67 (4) The method of distributing funds to participating health care 68 providers; 69 70 (5) The Program budget; Growth targets and resources needed to meet those targets; 71 (6)Assistance to eligible individuals to obtain State and federal 72 (7)health care coverage; 73 Policies and practices to maximize the use of County funds for 74 (8) direct services to clients: 75 Evaluation of policies and programs to improve access to health (9) 76 care and related services for low-income, [and] uninsured, and 77 underinsured County residents; 78 Strategic planning in support of the Health Care for the 79 (10)Uninsured programs administered by the Department, including: 80 (A) 81 Montgomery Cares;

[Termination] Reserved. *Date*. The Board terminates on December 31, 2021.] 98 [(a) Continuance of Board. By March 31, 2021, the Board must 99 **[**(b) recommend to the County Executive and County Council whether the 100 County should continue the Board or establish an alternative 101 governance structure for the Program.] 102 Sec. 2. **Expedited Effective Date.** 103 104 The Council declares that this legislation is necessary for the immediate protection of the public interest.
