
The County Council for Montgomery County, Maryland approves the following Act:

1 **Sec. 1. Section 1-405 is amended as follows:**

2 **1-405. County bird, [and] blossom, and tree.**

3 The robin is the [county] County bird. The dogwood is the [county] County
4 blossom. The black tupelo (also known as black gum, sourgum, pepperidge,
5 tupelo, and tupelogum), *Nyssa sylvatica*, is the County tree.




